

Update from Youth and Family Worker Ally Greenshields

It's that time again to provide an update on what has been going on in my new role as a Community and Development Worker within the church. It's been a long few months in which we can finally see the light at the end of the tunnel!

When we last spoke, the renovation of the downstairs hall was still a work in progress, but now I can thankfully say it is all finished.

The place needed a total renovation, from wiring and electrics, to painting and furnishing, and with the help from members of the congregation, a few favours, and not least a lot of funding from various sources, we have created a HUB at St Margaret's that I hope everyone can be proud of.

The HUB serves more of a purpose than to just look pretty and has seen quite a lot of uptake people within the community as well as the congregation. With the Council providing funding to be able to run two courses for the people of the area, with several other partners in place, looking to operate out of our church to encourage social change. I also want to encourage anyone in the congregation who wishes to use these facilities at any point, and for any reason, to please get in touch, as that's what it is there for.

Now on to the important part, the people. A lot of effort has been put in to increase the churches profile both within the community and as a charitable body, and I hope that people have started to see the very promising signs and enthusiasm starting to show through. While this may not necessarily be obvious from Sunday mornings a lot is going on behind the scenes.

Linda and Jim along with the rest of the JAM leadership continue to do a brilliant job, and it really is a pleasure to watch how they engage with the children.

The Tuesday café with Cheryl and Thorn has really started to take off, with a helping hand from their partners on a Thursday, with all the proceeds being re-invested back within the church. So if you can pop down on a Tuesday and help show our support.

Thursday café, as always, continues to put out excellent food and service with a smile (most of the time...) and what they do for the church both financially are for the people of the community really is something special.

Family night and Rosslyn continues to receive support, and are providing positive environments for the young families of Touch to be nurtured under the "roof" of the church.

The church facebook page is helping us to share the word of the church and encouraging more people to engage with us.

Finally, as of 11th May, the Youth Forum or Youth council of the church will be set up, which will allow the young people to have a voice and their ideas will be fed back to the Kirk Session at their next meeting.

So things are looking positive, and with the new faces popping through the door each week, for whatever reason, the church is starting to see some positive changes and engaging with people of the community who until now felt as though they had been forgotten.


I hope I'll go to heaven

J.A.M. Club Update

In the weeks since our last report, we have been continuing to place a firm focus on PRAYER. Many of our activities have been designed specifically to engage the children's interest and develop their understanding of prayer. We've explained the wonderful truth that Jesus is <u>always</u> available.....anytime and anywhere. As leaders, we have given examples of times and places we have prayed-boys and girls love it when adults give examples from personal experience.

We have explained how things (which we regard as impossible) are no problem for our Lord. It's always good when we can capture everyone's interest quickly! We have discovered that our children are really "wowed" by scientific experiments....so, to introduce one lesson, we had the boys and girls throw pieces of tissue at balloons (which had been rubbed on our jerseys.) The children were amazed to see the tissue cling to the balloons! This was a good lead into discussion about the amazing powers of God.

Craft times continue to be enjoyed and a very popular activity was decorating a plain white mug, which contained a wee block of post-it notes and a new pen. Each child used Sharpies to create their own Prayer Mug to take home. Oh how we leaders loved the peace during this time!

A new initiative has been to introduce our weekly prayer whiteboard. At the start of each session the children are asked for suggestions of people, events or situations for which they think our prayers are needed. We limit this to 3 topics, so that everyone has to really think carefully about their decisions. The suggested requests are later included in our end-of-meeting prayer when we gather again as one group. I'm happy to tell you that this is going well and is being taken very seriously by the children.

May I take this opportunity to say a **huge** "thank you" to everyone who so very generously contributed to our Easter Fayre. The amazing sum of £433 was raised! This support means such a lot to everyone at J.A.M. Club and there simply are no words which can sufficiently convey our gratitude...THANK YOU ALL!

I think the highlight of our time together so far this year has been the celebration of Easter. Some of you may know that I have been requesting egg cartons for the past year! Many thanks to all who dutifully ate eggs for breakfast, lunch and tea.....and yes, I know some of you felt you were sprouting feathers by the time we had sufficient boxes!!!

The point of the exercise was to provide each of our members with their own box of Resurrection eggs. This is a lovely way to remind us of the Easter story. 12 plastic eggs, each containing an object or picture, go in each box. For example, a small cube of bread was placed in the first one....a reminder of the Last Supper. My sincere thanks go to Marjory McIntosh who made wonderful "spears" and provided many objects to fill the eggs. Thanks also go to Helen Brown and Val Evans for their help in placing the items inside the eggs....all 25 boxes of them! I'm very happy to tell you that the children loved them and I have been told by parents that some boys and girls took their box to school for "Show and Tell" time.

Just before the school holidays, we had a service followed by a party....to celebrate Easter. Many parents and relatives joined us which made the event a happy, meaningful time for all of us. A particular highlight of the party was a visit from our very own "Professor Battie" alias John Thomson! (He is a scientist who does wonderful science experiments with us.) He bravely took part in a VERY Messy Challenge....see the J.A.M. Club noticeboard photos for evidence!

At the end of the evening, each child was given a Bible storybook or Christian-themed novel as a gift from St. Margaret's. The children also received a tub of sweets which of course contained an Easter egg.....we're happy that our boys and girls now understand the connection between their chocolate egg and the Easter story.

So folks, a great deal has been happening in the past few months and we now look forward to enjoying sunny, bright days with our children. We hope to have a J.A.M. Club outing and this is currently under discussion. The new # READ area is up and running-please do enjoy using this facility if you are in church with a child; there are books to suit all ages.




